Hadley Bootcamp (late July)

Faculty/staff receive feedback on all drills (fire, tornado, security, etc.). Data is shared by administrators on the success rate of each drill.



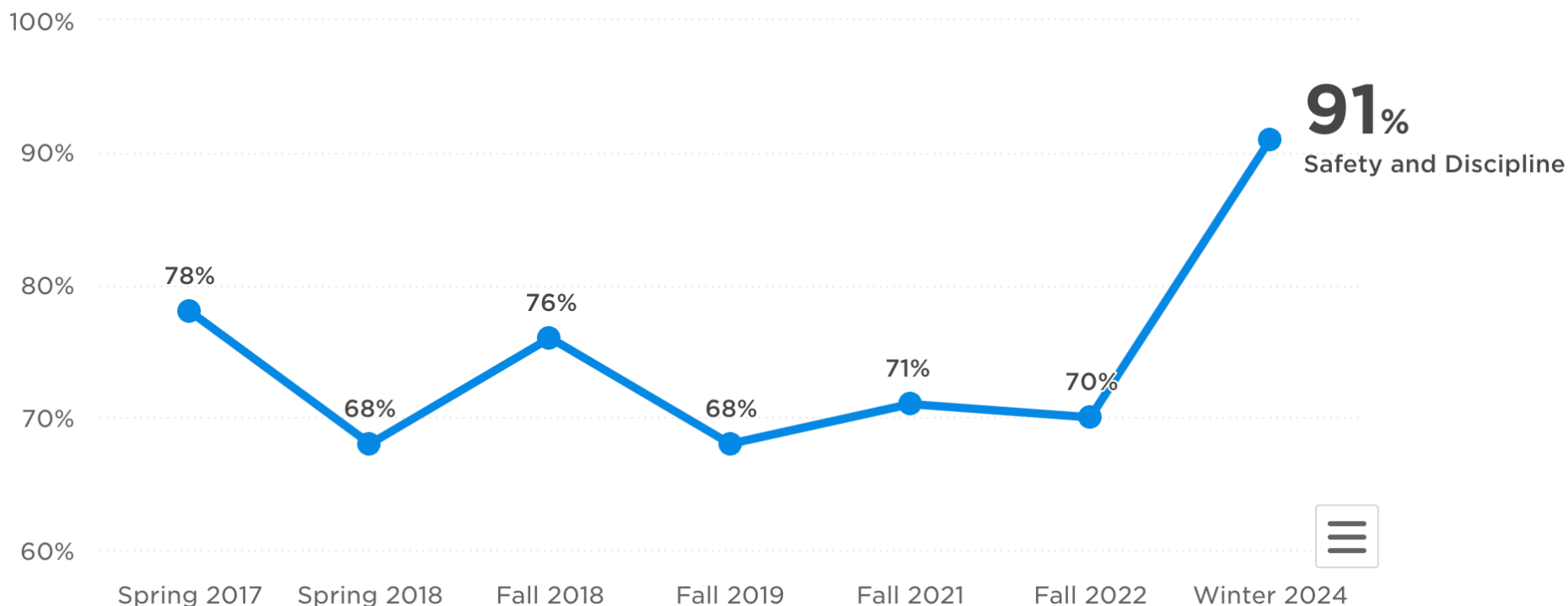
Safety and Discipline

Administrators schedule monthly grade level townhall meetings where we go over academic, behavioral, and attendance data. We also set goals and reinforce safety protocols such as not opening an outside door for anyone, not even the principal. These meetings give students an opportunity to ask questions about security drills, the need for them, and to reiterate their importance.
