## Some Perspective

- 1,164 train derailments in 2022 (Federal Railroad Administration)
  - 3 per day!
- 150 serious chemical incidents a year in the U.S. (EPA)
  - 1 every 2-3 days

#### Observations

- Assessing and addressing community needs are a necessary components of a response
  - Engagement can take many forms
- Identifying the "community" can be a challenge
- Need to build and maintain trust
- Need to be able to clearly communicate what you know and what you don't know
- Timeliness of data/information release is important but can be a challenge

#### Needs

- Support local and state health departments
  - Community Engagement Playbook
- Coordination across federal and state agencies
- Provide information of toxic substances
- Conduct health assessments
  - Short-term and long-term
- Physician education and training
  - Pediatric Environmental Health Specialty Units
- Address mental health impacts
  - Community Stress Resource Center
