# You're going to have to trust me on these.

- Tribes are sovereigns
- Tribes have a unique relationship with the United States
- Tribes and TECs are PHAs and can receive PHI
- Data sharing is a problem for Tribes and TECs generally
- Data is required to do public health and emergency response
