
Better study design from start to finish



Interviews with transgender and genderdiverse genomics study participants

"I don't know that [TGD people] would necessarily – especially with our political climate – trust institutions or researchers just in general because they're like,'Ohh no, no, I live in the South. I live in the Bible belt. If you ask me this, I'm gonna get put on a list" Participant 4

"There has been the controversy recently of a bunch of medical records being released ...with people who received gender affirming care [at VUMC]...There's always a little fear in the back of my mind about loss of privacy." – Participant 3
